Founder, Innocent Eyes, Inc., Waveland, MS

Christophe Duff is the founder of Innocent Eyes, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit, to promote a culture of zero tolerance of online sexual exploitation of children. He is an investigator in Waveland, Mississippi and speaks across the country about human trafficking, sex texting, cyberbullying, child enticement and child pornography. Duff formed a parent group called National Parent Army to bring parents together and provide education and resources to help our kids.

Chris will discuss these topics and share prevention strategies that educators, counselors, school administrators and parents can implement.

It takes each person to make a commitment to become a part of the 'whole person' trauma informed care community network, build a relationship with our children, identify the 'root cause' of their trauma, and guide them through healing and creating a successful life.

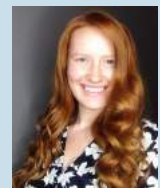
